New Business

Earth Day: We hope to sponser an Earth Day event again this year on a weekend near the official April 22 date. Rochelle Cohen, beautification chair, will be contacted to see if she can organize it; & an announcement requesting volunteers will be made at the March meeting.

WSSC Project: They plan to begin a 4 year dig & improvement project near CVP. The closest it will actually impact our community is at Beach Drive & Stoneybrook.

Reports

CKC: Sheila reported that at the last meeting State Legislators Al Carr, Jeff Waldstreider, & Richard Madaleno requested that CVP choose the three most important action items impacting our community that we want targeted for State Highway attention.

In response to this request we focused on safety, discussing:

I. For Capital View Ave.

(a) Methods of speed control, such as photo enforcement.

(b) Repainting pedestrian crosswalks & installation of crossing signs.

(c) Street lighting improvements e.g. replacement of certain non working bulbs.

II. For Forest Glen Metro Station: Installation of a barrier to prevent jay walking on the west side of the station.

This topic will be addressed at the CVPCA Annual Community Meeting on March 3. After any additional suggestions & discussion, Betsy will write a letter to Al Carr stating which three items CVPC consider most important to our community.

Margaret made & Nancye seconded a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:50 pm.
