- The meeting was called to order at 7:40.

- OLD BUSINESS

Sheila reported on the effort to cut back on train noise. Delegate Valerie Erwin has adopted the issue. Joe Rosenberg is the activist most closely involved with the effort and can be contacted for further information.

Sheila reported on the CKC meeting where legislators welcomed community input on improving safety on our state highways. Several suggestions were made for Capitol View Avenue, including the following, but not voted on:

1. Repaint cross walk at Leafy
2. Repair the right side of Stoneybrook where it meets Capitol View Avenue (and remove a tree?)
3. Fix CVA between Lee and Stoneybrook where a drop off has developed from erosion.

- NEW BUSINESS

Carol reported on a fence extension request which was approved. She also said that she has been in touch with the HPC on the issue of historic boundaries between CVPC and Homewood, but there is no resolution as of yet.

Betsy asked for volunteers/interest in celebrating Earth Day (cleaning the side of the road, mulching, planting around the signs, and having refreshments, etc. on either the weekend before or after Earth Day (the 19th or 26). Rochelle Cohen agreed to oversee it. Linda Winter suggested that we should also tackle invasive species removal.

Sheila reported on the expansion of the Naval Hospital when Walter Reed closes. CVP is within 3 miles of the campus and we may be affected by traffic, safety, etc.

Betsy reported that as far as she can determine the status of the Milton property and Legacy Open Space is still undecided.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 so that the Capitol View Review could be viewed. Terry Ireland offered to make copies of the DVD for those who are interested. Betsy Tebow will take the orders and the Citizens's Association will charge \$5.00.
